SPOTLIGHT: FRANKLIN COUNTY

'Souper Quick' and 'Soup for the Soul' reach hundreds



COVID-19 restrictions mean families are preparing more meals at home. To support the community, the Franklin County Extension Office partnered with the local library to offer Souper Quick. Soups are a great way to increase the variety of vegetables in your diet. This Facebook Live presentation focused on different types of soups and how to incorporate them when meal planning to increase vegetable consumption by demonstrating and sharing budget-friendly recipes. More than 300 (306) people viewed the virtual demo presentation. To attract members of underrepresented audiences, we offered the presentation under the title Soup for the Soul to two African American church groups, one in Lexington and one in Louisville. After the program, 75% of the participants reported being eager to prepare the Sweet Potato Chili recipe in the future.
