SPOTLIGHT: HICKMAN COUNTY

'Positive Employability' creates behavior change



Research says that 85% of job success comes from having well-developed soft and people skills, while only 15% of job success comes from technical skills and knowledge (hard skills). Employers are often prepared to teach technical job skills; however, the intangible skills of being a team player, time management, and positive attitude are difficult to teach on-site but are critical to success. To address this need, the Hickman County FCS Extension Office partnered with Hickman County High School, Hickman County KAPS Family Resource Center, Second Baptist Church, Career Coach Kim Watts, and many local businesses and led an Adulting Series and offered Positive Employability. The sessions offered interactive learning activities including Ten Soft Skills for Success, Communication Skills, and Professional Etiquette as well as resume and interview skills. After the program, 93% of participants reported planning to use their soft skills.
