Bag to go programs keep education going during pandemic



2020 Extension programming was suddenly required to shift from in-person programming to other platforms because of the COVID-19 pandemic. The Leslie County FCS Extension Office, along with many others, found creative ways to provide educational information to our community. Healthy at Home, Kids Club and Seasoned newsletters were some of the many resources we provided to hundreds of community members throughout the pandemic. Implementing the Bag to Go programs also made it possible to keep our community connected and involved in learning a variety of topics. Each bag included specialty items, activities, or lessons for families to do together and reached more than 1,480 people during the pandemic. Virtual programming provided a new avenue while Bag to Go programs kept traditional educational practices going in ways that made people feel comfortable, creative, and connected.
