'Patchwork Playdates' goes virtual, reaches hundreds of kids



The COVID-19 pandemic has interrupted so many important programs, not the least of which is Patchwork Playdates. Our preschool program has been one of the most popular programs in our office, always with great attendance and participation. To continue this programming, a 4-H Teen Club member practiced her storytelling techniques, and we coached her on the best ways to keep the children engaged during a story. She then read, recorded, and posted the stories on our Facebook page. We reached 889 local children, with an average of 178 children viewing each story. These stories were not only entertaining, but also offered lessons. We used advertisements, notifications, and a monthly newsletter to tell parents when the story times would be. The program has been beneficial for everyone involved.
