SPOTLIGHT: MCCRACKEN COUNTY

Big Blue Goals 2021



Annually, Family and Consumer Sciences agents and staff see increased interest from clients in health-behavior choices around the new year. This year, in an effort to reach both current and new clients, FCS Extension rolled out a new 10-week program called Big Blue Goals. Participants chose between an online platform that could be operated from a smartphone, computer, or tablet, or traditional paper format. They received regular information about a variety of topics such as preparing meals at home, increasing physical activity, consuming fruits and vegetables, making sound financial decisions, living well, and increased relationship skills. Participants were rewarded with incentive items for their efforts and for their continued participation. Statewide, 1,497 individuals participated resulting in 337,124 minutes of physical activity.
