SPOTLIGHT: MERCER COUNTY

Addiction education programs helps communities



Kentucky counties have seen increases in hospitalizations, infectious diseases, nonfatal overdoses, and other complications related to drug use since the pandemic began. In response to this growing issue, the Mercer County FCS Extension agent worked in conjunction with the Kentucky Extension Homemakers Association (KEHA) leader training system to offer an evening addiction education session. Collaborating among eight contiguous Central Kentucky counties, agents convened community leaders and stakeholders to discuss the nature of the addiction crisis and to explore solutions. A local county prosecutor, treatment providers, and even individuals with lived experience joined a panel discussion to help 55 participants better understand addiction, stigma, and available resources.
