# 'Parent Academy' reaches first-time moms



More than 48% of Owsley County children live in poverty, and more than 47% are not ready for kindergarten. In Owsley County, teen births are higher than the state average, and more than 45% of pregnant women smoke during pregnancy. To address this issue, the Owsley County FCS Extension Office collaborated with the local health department and Kentucky River Community Care to offer a six-part virtual series, with one in-person session, titled Parent Academy. The program addressed prenatal care, delivery, infant health and safety, parenting, nutrition, and access to health and child development services. We placed advertisements in the local newspaper, on social media, and in newsletters. Half of the participants were first-time mothers. After the program, many participants reported knowing more about the benefits of breastfeeding, car seat safety, and baby milestones.
