SPOTLIGHT: ROWAN COUNTY

Homemakers sew more than 4,000 masks



2020 offered an entire new look to volunteer work in Extension. Two Rowan County FCS Extension Homemakers used donated elastic, fabric, and thread to make masks for front-line workers, nursing homes, medical workers, friends, Homemakers, schoolchildren, sport teams, banks, and complete strangers in 12 states. They even sent to local government agencies including the mayor, judges, and the courthouse staff. They completed 4,066 masks during the pandemic using about 508 yards of fabric, 1,355 yards of elastic, 135 spools of thread, 10 needles, 75 to 85 envelopes or packages, 10 rotate cutter blades, 1 cutting mat, and several Band-Aids. The county judge executive recognized our Homemakers for a job well done in a time of need by sending official letters to each of them.
