SPOTLIGHT: SHELBY COUNTY

Surviving, thriving during pandemic with grab and go bags



The COVID-19 outbreak was classified as a global pandemic. The entire country was shut down except for declared essential workers. There was a mandatory order that groups were unable to assemble because of possible public health risks. The Shelby County FCS Extension agent and Nutrition Education Program assistant addressed the situation by offering educational activities and publications on the Extension office's front porch. We offered grab and go packets each week with rotating themes. Themes included the Sizzlin' Summer Series, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention guidelines on proper hand-washing, recipes for budget-friendly and healthy food, and tips for growing produce. The grab and go packets helped people to not only survive but to thrive during the pandemic.
