SPOTLIGHT: WAYNE COUNTY

'Use Less, Spend Wi\$e Challenge' prepares for holiday spending



Americans spent more than \$1 trillion during the holidays in 2018. That number rose another 4.5% in 2019. While holiday spending was at an all-time high pre-pandemic, many families across Kentucky may have less to spend during the 2020 holiday season. When tighter budgets are coupled with pandemic-related supply shortages, it is important to learn smarter ways to stretch consumer dollars and resources. To raise awareness and help consumers meet this need, the Wayne County FCS Extension agent challenged families to join the Use Less, Spend Wi\$e Challenge. Participants completed activities designed to help them use less, spend wisely, and discover low-cost ways to connect with others. Participants reported keeping a daily spending diary, one participant reported having learned to use things that were already in their home.
