# Recovery Week features yoga, road cleanup, virtual 5K



According to the National Institute on Drug Abuse, people who are recovering from a substance use disorder are finding it difficult to maintain their sobriety during COVID-19. Most have uprooted their routine and lack social support, which are essential to maintaining a healthy recovery. In response to this emerging issue, the Wolfe County FCS Extension agent, Family Resource and Youth Service Center, and the Agency for Substance Abuse Policy (ASAP) partnered to host Wolfe County Recovery Week. The Wolfe County judge executive signed a proclamation declaring July 27 through Aug. 2 Wolfe County Addiction Recovery Week. The week included events like socially distanced yoga, a community-wide road cleanup, a virtual Recovery Celebration, and a virtual 5K. A total of 369 people participated in the Recovery Week events, and we reached more than 65,000 people.
