

Promoting Recovery Online through Financial Instruction and addiction Training



- **Addiction 101** trains professionals on aspects of substance use disorder (SUD) including risk factors, addiction as a chronic brain disorder, and evidence-based strategies for long-term recovery. Addiction 101 aims to increase knowledge of SUD, reduce stigma, foster comfortability in working with people with SUD, and encourage creative ways to engage with this historically marginalized population.
- **Recovering Your Finances (RYF)** is an eight-session comprehensive financial education and soft skills curriculum for individuals in early SUD recovery. RYF aims to decrease the likelihood of return to use due to financial stress and increase community recovery capital by providing training to local providers and recovery coalitions. PROFIT will teach professionals how to use RYF with clients. Participants who successfully complete PROFIT will receive free access to the RYF curriculum.
