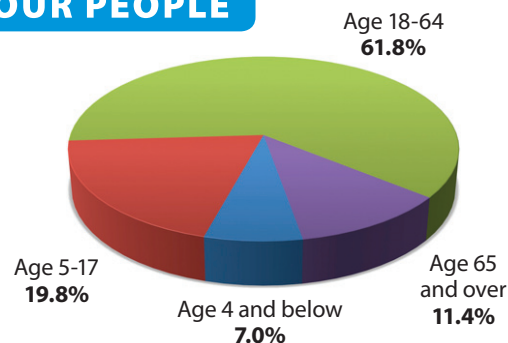
- **Making Healthy Lifestyle Choices** that influence health and well-being

In 2010-2011, Family and Consumer Sciences Extension made **35,327** contacts with Gallatin County individuals and families.<sup>2</sup>

## SECURING FINANCIAL STABILITY

**F**or many, couponing can help families have greater buying power at the grocery. To help stretch food dollars while feeding nutritious meals, Gallatin County Family and Consumer Sciences Agent taught 368 individuals a nine-session, "Crazy for Coupons," which covered menu planning, organization, and using coupons and sales. Of surveys mailed to participants eight weeks after the class, 126 returned it, reporting that 83% saved an average of \$27.82, or 20.6%, of their weekly grocery bill as a result. 69% prepared more meals at home. 37% were able to achieve financial goals more quickly. One participant said, "I don't work outside the home so this is my way of contributing and saving as much as possible."

## OUR FAMILIES

According to the 2010 Census,<sup>1</sup> of families in Gallatin County with their own children...

- **64.6%** are husband-wife families
- **35.4%** are single parent families

**In addition, there are:**

- **3,160** households
- **1,192** households with 1 or more persons under the age of 18
- **264** grandchildren under 18 years old who live with a grandparent householder
- **697** households with at least one person age 65 and over



### As a result of participation in Gallatin County Extension programs:<sup>2</sup>

- **900** people increased knowledge of lifestyle changes to improve personal health.
- **80** people increased knowledge of parenting and personal relationships.
- **120** people increased knowledge of safe storage, handling and food preparation.

## OUR COMMUNITY

In 2009, the most recent data available, the median household income in Gallatin County was **\$40,603**.<sup>3</sup>

The number of children in poverty in Gallatin County was **607** compared to **545** in 2006.<sup>3</sup>

The total number of people receiving Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits in Gallatin County is **1,948** in 2011.<sup>4</sup>

### As a result of participation in Gallatin County Extension programs:<sup>2</sup>

- **60** people increased leadership knowledge and skills.
- **120** people improved communication skills to address community issues.
- **420** people developed skills to access affordable food.

## OUR ECONOMY

According to the 2010 American Community Survey 5-year estimates,<sup>6</sup> between 2005 and 2009 in Gallatin County it is estimated that...

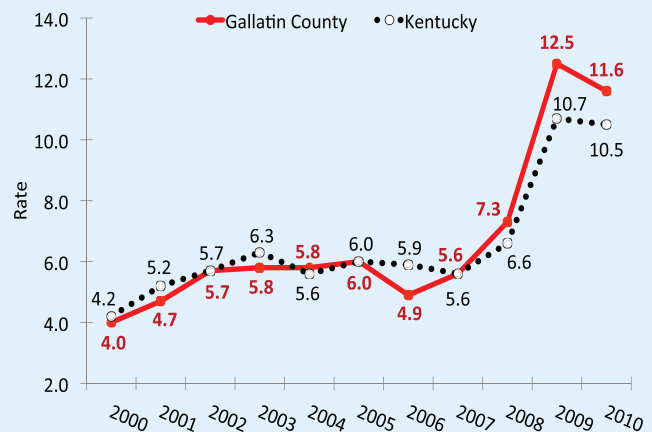
- **43.8%** (+/- **9.9**) are married-couple families with both husband and wife in the labor force
- **72.8%** (+/- **20**) are children under 6 years old with all parents in the labor force
- **12.2%** (+/- **8**) are people 65 years and over below poverty level during the past 12 months

### As a result of participation in Gallatin County Extension programs:<sup>2</sup>

- **20** people increased knowledge of economic and enterprise development.
- **350** people adopted money management practices to reduce debt and increase savings.
- **76** people demonstrated increased practical living skills.
